- The Goal
 - To successfully maintain housing stability in the community,
 - Continue with their recovery, and
 - Increase self-sufficiency.

- Funding provided through the Georgia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities (DBHDD)
 - Without funding, many individuals would be homeless, hospitalized or incarcerated

- Benefits
 - Decreases homelessness
 - Decreases psychiatric hospitalizations
 - Decreases Emergency Room visits
 - Decreases contact with law enforcement
 - Decreases incarceration

- Types of Residential Services offered:
 - Intensive Residential Services
 - 24/7 Supported Housing
 - Semi-Independent Residential Services

Intensive Residential

- Group home setting
- 24/7 on-site assistance
- Licensed by HFRD (HealthCare Facilities Regulation Division)
 - Personal Care Home, or
 - Community Living Arrangement
- Locations
 - Savannah: 4 group homes
 - Douglas: 1 group home
 - Albany: 2 group homes
 - Columbus: 2 group homes

Residential: 24/7 Supported Housing

- Provided in a congregate apartment community.
- 24/7 on-site assistance
- Licensed by HFRD (HealthCare Facilities Regulation Division)
 - Private Home Care
- Locations
 - Savannah
 - Douglas
 - Columbus

Semi-Independent Residential

- Provide in *integrated* apartment community
- 36 hours per week of on-site programming
- Locations
 - Augusta
 - Savannah
 - Columbus

Challenges/Opportunities: Financial

- Challenges
 - No income
 - Poor credit history

- Opportunities
 - DBHDD provides funding for Residential services
 - Partner with HUD housing
 - Apartment leases in agency name
 - Sign as financial guarantor on apartment leases
 - Provide representative payee support

Challenges/Opportunities: Background history

- Challenges
 - Criminal history
 - Prior evictions

- Opportunities
 - Find apartment complexes that are willing to allow our program to provide onsite services
 - Provide on-site support
 - Respond to issues as they arise

Challenges/Opportunities: Need for on-site support

- Challenges
 - Poor medication adherence
 - Lack of independent living skills
 - Poor social skills

- Opportunities
 - Provide Supervision of Self-Administration of Medication
 - Provide skills training in the areas of: budgeting, grocery shopping, cooking, cleaning
 - Provide social skills training

Challenges/Opportunities: Transitions

- Challenges
 - Individuals served become comfortable in current placement and do not want to transition
- Opportunities
 - Explain nature and purpose of placement as transitional skills training opportunity
 - Provide continuum of residential options
 - Assist in finding step down housing options
