Tips & Tricks

- Express cost concerns with doctor before leaving appointment
- Bring a copy of your insurer's list of preferred prescription drugs to your appointment
- If your medication comes in more than one strength, consult doctor about splitting the higher strength tablets to reduce cost
- Check for generic medications that are always offered for free or low-cost at Publix, Walmart², and Costco
- Ask doctor/pharmacist if an OTC drug or a similar, less expensive generic medication would work just as well as the one you're currently taking
- Use a combination medication instead of two separate medications
- Ask for a 90-day prescription rather than a 30-day prescription to avoid paying multiple co-pays
- Ask doctor's office and pharmacist if they have any samples or coupons/rebate offers for your prescription(s)
- Find out if the drug manufacturer offers any hardship programs or request coupons by mail from drug manufacturer's website
- Call several pharmacies to see who has the best price
- Use a mail-order option
- If your medication is not on your insurer's formulary³, request an exception with the help of your doctor
- Some organizations offer special discounts for members (AARP, AAA, Sam's Club, etc.)
- Drug discount cards offer instant savings on medications. To use, go online and type the name of the drug, dose, number of pills, and where you live. Then you'll see what you can expect to pay at various pharmacies using the discount coupon, which you can print out or download to your phone to show the pharmacist.
 Most commonly prescribed medications are free to \$7.50 for a 90-day supply at Publix and \$4 for a 30-day supply or \$10 for a 90-day supply at Walmart.
- Typically includes antibiotics, vitamins, blood pressure, heart, and diabetes medication. It may be cheaper to pay out of pocket and bypass your insurance. 3. Provides which alternative medications are covered, restrictions, and quantity limits by your insurance.

PRESCTIPTION ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Partnership for Prescription Assistance



Sponsored by America's biopharmaceutical research companies, PPA is a free service that helps uninsured and underinsured patients access assistance programs that offer prescription medicines for free or nearly free.

HOW DOES PPA WORK?

- 1. Go to www.pparx.org.
- 2. Tell us what prescription medicines you take.
- 3. Tell us about yourself (age, income, health coverage, etc.).
- Get your results and decide which patient assistance programs you would like to apply to.
- 5. Complete the application process.

Your primary care physician's office may need to work with you to file the necessary forms with the drug manufacturer.

OTHER WAYS TO SAVE

If you are a **resident of DeKalb or Fulton County**, you may be eligible for a Grady card to access the Grady Pharmacy. For an appointment with a Financial Counselor, please call 404-616-6920.

If you have a **rare disease**, you may qualify for assistance from the National Organization for Rare Disorders, 1-800-999-6673.

If you are a **veteran**, the VA offers prescription drug coverage for retired veterans, their families, and survivors.

If you have **Medicare**, contact GeorgiaCares, 1-866-552-4464, to receive help from the State Health Insurance Assistance Program. Medicare also offers extra help with premiums and out-of-pocket costs to qualifying low-income beneficiaries who participate in Medicare Part D.

Financial Assistance Program

If you live in Fulton or DeKalb County, Grady Health System and Children's Healthcare of Atlanta - Hughes Spalding offers discounted care under a Financial Assistance Program to qualified individuals for emergency and medically necessary services. Eligible patients will not be charged more than amounts generally billed to those with insurance.

For an appointment with a Financial Counselor to determine if you are eligible, please call (404) 616-1000 (Option 4). Your information will be evaluated for financial assistance.

Grady Card

Who is Eligible?

- The amount of financial assistance you may receive depends on your income, family size, and county of residence.
- Patients with a family income at 400% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) or below may be eligible for a discount.
- Persons experiencing homelessness can recieve free services with 3rd party verification.

What Services are Covered?

- Emergency and medically necessary care provided within the Grady Health System and Children's Healthcare of Atlanta – Hughes Spalding.
- The program covers services provided by all physicians and advanced practice providers associated with your care.
- The program does not cover cosmetic services.

Required Documents?

- Government issued ID
- Proof of Residency (lease contract, utility bills, rent receipt, food stamps, voter registration card, etc.)
- Proof of Income (current pay check stub, Social Security Administration letter, unemployment claim, etc.)
- Proof of Number of Dependents (most recent tax return, dependents' birth certificates, etc.)
- Medicare Card (if applicable)
- Visa or Resident Alien Card (if applicabale)


